Virtual reality headset: Jane Delamere explained about the virtual reality headset she has been looking into. Just like a game console or Xbox we could use it as an alternative enrichment for the children. It's a dynamic piece of equipment that will really engage quite a large number of children regardless of age or ability. It is seen as an educational tool depending on what apps you download for the VR headset, e.g. travel apps (where you 'go' to different places in the world), underwater life. Amanda mentioned some alternative therapies use it for core balance to build up confidence for children with low muscle tone or for relaxation. Karen asked if it's going to be available to all the kids in the school. Jane mentioned it's up to the teacher, if they think if it's beneficial for their class or certain children, but it has to be carefully managed. Jane also mentioned she is trying to arrange a digi-bus to come to the car park so all the children can have a look. It has virtual reality environments like a dentist's waiting room etc. The Meta Quest2 headset costs about £400 and the apps will be around £7 each.

Donations: It was mentioned in the last meeting we can use the Just Giving platform for donations to the PTA. Lucy mentioned we can give parents a choice, either pay cash or pay via the link. **Action for Karen to create the link for our Just Giving page and send it out on different letters we send to parents and in the text reminders.** Amanda mentioned there's also something out there called BOPP Payment Solutions with a QR-code. **Amanda will share the info on our What's app group.**

Lucy – to do some research and discuss with Jane how many we will need to start with.
